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
Introduction





I noticed there were no questions regarding the cost of the graduate program. While FSU was a far more affordable option than many other graduate programs I looked into, I still wonder why the price tag is so exorbitant. Perhaps if there weren't so many frivolous levels of bureaucracy built into the college system it could function as it should, as a means to educate students and advance careers of professionals. Instead we have departments such as the one conducting this survey "the Office of Institutional Effectiveness! Honestly, this sounds like a comic's punchline. I'd be embarrassed to [redacted] admit that I receive a paycheck for working in such a department.

To be clear, I appreciated the work of the professors and valued the courses that comprised the graduate program I belonged to. I simply can't tolerate the bloated cost of "higher education". As a parent of two recent college graduates, I fully understand that this is a broken system that will not continue as currently constituted. "Forgiving debt" is certainly not a solution "more like an additional crime added to the original offense. The real solution is cutting costs and if anyone working in so called "higher education" can't figure that out it simply speaks to the institutional greed that so permeates education in America today.
