Bridge to University and Professional Success Class Descriptions

ESLB B000 Individualized English Language Study Plan

For students who want to work one-to-one with an instructor focusing on their chosen areas of English language study. Students are matched with an instructor to develop a 14-week Individualized English Language Study Plan to practice and improve grammar, reading, writing, conversation, pronunciation, preparation for TOEFL and other exams, job-seeking skills, English for specific purposes (such as medicine, science and technology, engineering, or business) or to practice conversation skills. All study plans, including assignment of the instructor, are approved by the program director. NOTE: This class meets either one (1) or (2) hours per week depending on which section the student enrolled.

ESLB B001 Transitions 10: Writing, Research, and Presentations

For students who have achieved an advanced level of English fluency and want to further develop their academic and professional writing, research techniques, presentations, and intercultural awareness for successful participation in American or global academic or professional environments. NOTE: This class meets five (5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at an Advanced Level in writing or have successfully completed ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language: Level 4 or higher.

ESLB B002 Transitions 11: Advanced Pronunciation, Interviewing, & Presentation Skills

For students who have achieved an advanced level of English fluency but want to further develop their oral communication skills for greater success in an academic or professional environment. Students learn accent modification (advanced level pronunciation techniques), make effective presentations, and interview professionals in the community to gain their advice for how to make successful connections for academic and professional career opportunities. Note: This class meets five (5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at an Advanced Level in oral and written skills or have successfully completed ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language: Level 4 or higher.

Community English as a Second Language Class Descriptions

ESLC C010 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Levels 1 to 5

For adult members of our community with limited to advanced English proficiency to gain basic skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness that promotes successful communication experiences in common everyday encounters in American society. Level 1 thru 5 are available and students are moved to the appropriate level after the first class meeting. NOTE: All levels and sections of this class will meet 4 hours per week.

ESLC C011 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 1

For adult members of our community with limited English proficiency to gain basic skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness that promotes successful communication experiences in common everyday encounters in American society. NOTE: This class meets 4 hours per week.

ESLC C012 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 2

For adult members of our community with limited English proficiency to expand basic skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness to further promote successful communication experiences in common everyday encounters in American society. NOTE: This class meets 4 hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them in Level 2 or have successfully completed ESLC C011 Community English as a Second Language: Level 1.

ESLC C013 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 3

For adult members of our community with developing English proficiency to expand intermediate level skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness to promote successful experiences in increasingly complicated communication encounters in American society. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them in level 3 or have successfully completed ESLC C012 Community English as a Second Language: Level 2.

ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 4

For adult members of our community with advancing English proficiency to expand advancing level skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness to promote successful experiences in complicated communication encounters in American society, a professional environment, and preparing for further academic study. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them in level 4 or have successfully completed ESLC C013 Community English as a Second Language: Level 3.

ESLC C015 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 5

For adult members of our community with advanced English proficiency to further expand their advanced level skills in speaking, listening, vocabulary, reading, writing, and intercultural awareness to promote successful communication required in professional and academic environments. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them in Level 5 or have successfully completed ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language: Level 4.

Focus Classes

Beginning Level:

ESLC C020 Focus on Basic Conversation and Writing

For adult members of our community with limited and developing English skills who want to improve their conversation and writing abilities through improved vocabulary, pronunciation, grammar, composition skills, and intercultural awareness. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students should have test results that place them at or below Level 3 to take this class.

Community English as a Second Language Class Descriptions (Continued)

Intermediate Level:

ESLC C030 Focus on Pronunciation, Vocabulary, and Reading

For adult members of our community with intermediate level English skills who want to gain extra practice and reinforcement with vocabulary, pronunciation, and reading activities that will help them improve oral fluency and reading comprehension. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must have test at Level 3 or 4 or have successfully completed ESLC Community English as a Second Language: Level 2.

ESLC C033 Focus on Pronunciation and Grammar

For adult members of our community with intermediate level English skills who want to learn, practice, and review pronunciation and grammar components through interactive activities with other students and native speakers. This class helps students prepare for advanced speaking and writing classes and improve social interactions. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week for seven (7) weeks. Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them at a level 3 or higher to take this class.

ESLC C036 Focus on Reading and Writing Fundamentals

For adult members of our community with intermediate level English skills who want to focus on the fundamentals of grammar and writing communication in everyday life such as emails, letters, notes, and short essays. Reading skills are also developed. This class meets four (4) hours per weeks for seven (7) weeks. Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them at a Level 3 or higher to take this class.

ESLC C040 Focus on Conversation and Pronunciation

For adult members of our community with developing and advancing English skills who want to focus their studies on conversational English, vocabulary, and extended pronunciation practice to improve their ability in oral communication. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must have test scores that place them at Level 3 or higher to take this class.

ESLC C043 Focus on Grammar, Writing, and Speaking

For adult members of our community with intermediate and advancing level English skills who want to gain the benefit of extra practice with writing and speaking activities. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must test at Level 3 or higher or have successfully completed ESLC 012 Community English as a Second Language: Level 2.

High Intermediate/Advanced Level:

ESLC C048 Focus on Communication and Public Speaking Skills

For adult members of our community with high intermediate or advanced level English skills who want to gain experience in communication situations such as making presentations, professional interviews, and improving their use of pronunciation and language structure. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Advanced Level:

ESLC C050 Focus on Improving English Writing Skills

For adult members of our community with advancing level English skills who want to review and practice the fundamentals of composition, grammar, and format for writing effective essays, academic or professional papers, and presentations. NOTE: This class meets 4 hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them at a Level 4 or higher.

ESLC C051 Focus on Essentials for Advanced English Writing Skills

For adult members of our community with advancing level English skills who want to build on basic English skills by improving vocabulary and grammar, and learning and practicing writing skills that are relevant to everyday communications for life and job-related skills such as letter-writing and emails, as well as writing short essays. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week for seven (7) weeks. Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 4 or higher.

ESLC C052 Focus on Effective English Writing Techniques

For adult members of our community with advancing level English skills who want to review and practice the fundamentals of composition, grammar, and format for writing effective essays and making presentations. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week for seven (7) weeks. Prerequisite: Students must have test results placing them at a Level 4 or higher.

ESLC C053 Focus on English, Business, and Communication Skills

For adult members of our community with advanced, non-native English proficiency who want to learn and practice communication skills for success in an American or global professional environment. Instruction in business leadership, effective communication for presentations and project collaboration, and English is blended to improve students' confidence and ability to understand and interact effectively for developing professional skills. Interviewing and resume writing are also be taught. NOTE: This class meets 4 hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them at a Level 4 or higher.

ESLC C055 Focus on Improving Pronunciation

For adult members of our community with intermediate or advanced level English skills who want to focus on improving oral communication and pronunciation skills that will enhance social interactions with native speakers while developing stronger grammar and spelling proficiency in writing. NOTE: This class meets 4 hours per week. Prerequisite: Students must have test results that place them at a Level 4 or higher and have successfully completed at least one semester of ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language: Level 4.

Community English as a Second Language Class Descriptions (Continued)

ESLC C060 Focus on Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) Preparation

For adult members of our community with advanced level English skills who want to prepare to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) which is required for admission to most college or university programs. Students learn study skills and test-taking strategies and content for all sections of the iBT and Institutional TOEFL which include listening and reading comprehension, writing, and speaking. This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must be at high level 4 or level 5 or have successfully completed at least one semester of ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 4.

ESLC C061 Focus on Building Content Skills for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

For adult members of our community with advanced level English skills who want to prepare to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) which is required for admission to most college or university programs. Students build skills for the content areas of the iBT and institutional TOEFL, including reading and listening comprehension, writing, and speaking. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week for seven (7) weeks.

Prerequisite: Students must be at high level 4 or level 5 or have successfully completed at least one semester of ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 4.

ESLC C062 Focus on Test Taking Strategies for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

For adult members of our community with advanced level English skills who want to prepare to take the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL) which is required for admission to most college and university programs. In addition to the components of reading and listening comprehension, writing, and speaking, this class will include a brief overview of study-skills and test-taking strategies to achieve successful results on the TOEFL exam. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week for seven (7) weeks.

Prerequisite: Students must be at high level 4 or level 5 or have successfully completed at least one semester of ESLC C014 Community English as a Second Language (ESL): Level 4.

Intensive English as a Second Language Class Descriptions

Intensive Core Classes:

Beginning Level:

ESLI I001 Basic Intensive Listening and Speaking

For students who want to develop the use and comprehension of basic level vocabulary, pronunciation, and language structure of spoken English. Students who have never studied English before should also enroll in Specialized Tutoring in order to learn basic greetings, alphabet, numbers, pronouns, and basic English structure. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

ESLI I011 Basic Intensive Reading, Writing, and Grammar

For students who need to develop basic vocabulary and reading comprehension skills from short authentic texts in English. Students also learn and practice basic language structure and organization for writing paragraphs. Students who have never studied English before should also enroll in Specialized Tutoring in order to learn basic greetings, alphabet, numbers, pronouns, and basic English structure. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Intermediate Level:

ESLI I002 Intermediate Intensive Listening and Speaking

For students who are ready to expand their understanding and use of language at near native rate of speech; identify main idea and supporting elements of longer presentations of spoken language; learn extended vocabulary and pronunciation skills and correctly use language structure to convey common everyday ideas in conversation and presentations. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 3 or have successfully completed ESLI 001 Basic Intensive Listening and Speaking.

ESLI I012 Intermediate Intensive Reading, Writing, and Grammar

For students who need to build on basic English skills by improving vocabulary; identifying and summarizing the main idea and intent of various literary forms; and writing a logically constructed essay using 80% correct language structure. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 3 or have successfully completed ESLI I011 Basic Intensive Reading, Writing, and Grammar.

Advanced Level:

ESLI I003 Advanced Intensive Listening and Speaking

For students who want to gain proficiency at comprehending complex spoken language; engage with native speakers in unfamiliar contexts; and speak fluently using correct vocabulary as well as correct pronunciation and language structure appropriate for an American academic environment. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 4 or have successfully completed ESLI I002 Intermediate Intensive Listening and Speaking.

ESLI I013 Advanced Intensive Reading, Writing, and Grammar

For students who want to expand their comprehension and use of English language vocabulary; complex language structure; academic texts written at a college-level; and writing various forms of essays suitable for higher education in an American academic environment. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 4 or higher on writing sample test or have successfully completed ESLI I012 Intermediate Intensive Reading, Writing, and Grammar.

Intensive English as a Second Language Class Descriptions (Continued)

Focus Classes:

Beginning Level:

ESLI I021 Essential English for Academic Success

For beginning level students who want to acquire basic academic English and gain confidence in speaking and listening skills by experiencing American cultural through authentic interactions with native English speakers. Note: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

ESLI I022 Intercultural Communication Skills for your American Experience

Designed to introduce students to learn to identify and adjust to the key differences in cultural norms, practices, and expectations that can cause confusion between people from different cultures. Emphasis is on identifying the possible barriers and how to overcome these barriers to ensure a successful experience while in the United States. Note: This class meets 2 hours/week.

Beginning/Intermediate Level:

ESLI I026 Improving Pronunciation and Grammar

For beginning or intermediate level students who want to focus on improving their pronunciation and grammar skills. Students learn and practice techniques for improving both skills through inter-active activities such as games and discussions. Opportunities are provided for students to practice speaking English with native English speakers. This class is not suitable for students who have never studied English before. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

ESLI I030 Conversation, American Culture, and Cinema

For beginning or intermediate level students to engage more deeply with English language as it is expressed in human interactions and presented artistically in films and stories. Students learn and practice vocabulary, grammar, pronunciation, and American culture in the context of story-telling, dialogues, and films. This class is not suitable for students who have never studied English before. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Intermediate Level:

ESLI I041 Improving Pronunciation, Vocabulary, and Reading Skills

For intermediate or advanced level students who want to engage more deeply with English through reading various forms of American literature (short stories, articles, and short books). Students learn techniques for improving their pronunciation and vocabulary skills and engage in lively class discussions around specific themes that correlate with the literature. Note: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Intermediate/Advanced Level:

ESLI I050 Communication Skills and Public Speaking

For intermediate and advanced students at a high intermediate level and above who want to learn and gain experience in communication situations such as making presentations, professional interviews, and improving their use of pronunciation and language structure. Note: This class meets four (4) hours per week.

Advanced Level:

ESLI I060 Intensive English Writing for Professional Purposes

For students who have achieved an advanced level of English fluency and would like to develop specialized writing skills to use in the context of their profession. Class content includes: how to write a literature review; research practice; documenting sources using citations and references; advanced paraphrasing; and practicing various writing styles, including writing for publication, consumer and business letters, memorandums, and short reports. NOTE: This class meets seven and one-half (7.5) hours per week.

Prerequisite: Students must test at a Level 4 or higher on writing sample test.

ESLI I064 Preparation Essentials for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

For advanced level students who want to achieve successful results on each section of the iBT and Institutional TOEFL exams. This class includes instruction of content for all sections of the TOEFL exam—listening and reading comprehension, speaking, and essay writing. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week. The Institutional TOEFL is administered at the end of the term.

ESLI I067 Strategies for Success on the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL)

For advanced level students who are preparing to take the iBT or Institutional TOEFL. This class is designed to help students acquire test-taking strategies for achieving a successful score on the reading comprehension, speaking, listening and essay-writing portions of the TOEFL. The Institutional TOEFL is administered at the end of the term. NOTE: This class meets four (4) hours per week. Students are recommended to enroll in this class in combination with ESLI I064 Preparation Essentials for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL).
